HOW DO I KNOW IF IT'S A SHORT DAY???? At 11.45am each day it is decided if we will finish at the earlier time of 2.35pm if the forecast is due for rain during the school lunch hour or if rain is set in for the day. Sometimes it may be raining in the morning but forecast to clear and turn out sunny so an early finish may not be necessary. ICE SKATE TOUR IS COMING TO TOWN!

Havelock Primary School Home and School have an ice rink from Thursday 10 May 2018 to Sunday 20 May 2018, which is open to the public each evening and weekends.

See Eventfinder for more details on session times. Due to unprecedented demand you can guarantee a skate by emailing hnpshomeandschool@gmail.com for presales with your surname, session date/time and tickets required. There will also be some gate sales.

The state of the art, artificial ice rink has 97% same gliding capacity as natural ice and is 100% green! It's pretty close to ice skating on natural ice, just a bit easier for beginners as it's not quite so slippery. Thousands of kids, adults and families will enjoy a unique ice skate experience.

It's safe, fun and value for money -\$8 for children (under 16), \$12 for adults and \$35 for a family ticket with skates and helmets provided. Gloves and socks also need to be worn but there are spares if you forget. You are guaranteed half an hour with longer if capacity allows. There is no minimum age however the smallest ice skates are size 9 which is roughly the shoe size of a 4/5 year old. Spectators are free!

Food, drink and Eftpos including credit card facility will be available.
