from the DHB. Even if you do not consent, the form needs to be filled in and returned to school (Section B) Many thanks to those who have returned them. Spare forms in the office.

SICK CHILDREN PROCEDURES We request that students who are sick do not come to school so as to stop the spread of bugs to others. If a child falls sick while at school it is our procedure to ring a Parent/Caregiver to have them collected. If a Parent/Caregiver cannot be contacted – the emergency contact will then be called.

For safety reasons schools cannot provide students with panadol, aspirin or other medication without parent consent. A signed request must be made to the Office should you wish medication from home to be dispensed at school. This request must identify the medication, dose and time medication should be administered. Requests must be signed and dated by a Parent/Caregiver. All care will be taken, however the school accepts no liability. Advice from medical practitioners indicates that the administering of antibiotics can be effectively managed through doses outside of school hours.

<u>EMERGENCY / ACCIDENTS</u> On the odd occasion there are accidents that happen with students in School that sometimes require the services of either a medical doctor/nurse and or ambulance service and sometimes Mum/Dad/Caregiver. We endeavour to call on these services to provide the best care for our students should an accident occur.

For minor accidents (cuts, bumps, grazes etc), students are treated with basic first aid (antiseptic spray, ice packs, plasters, rest, time out, TLC) and students are happy to return to class/sport/PE. They are also advised to return to the Office and seek further assistance should their condition/injury worsen or cause discomfort.

Every attempt is made to contact the Parents/Caregivers in the first instance when the patient is uncomfortable and distressed; alternatively we often seek medical treatment from the Napier Health Centre. In all cases, student safety is always paramount and to err on the side of caution we sometimes make contact with Parents to seek medical advice just to be safe.
